

Amador-Sunrise Land Registry



The Amador-Sunrise Land Registry is a membership group of private landowners who share an appreciation for the rural and natural heritage of the Amador-Sunrise area in Chisago County, and are interested in caring for their land in ways that protect these values. There is no cost to participate. Benefits of membership include invitation to quarterly informational gatherings focused on conservation topics, and personalized ecological services, including an “Ecologist Walk-about” to learn about your land’s natural features and get ideas for possible conservation strategies. Members also enjoy the opportunity to meet other conservation-minded landowners living in their communities: people who care about good water quality in the Sunrise and St. Croix Rivers, the preservation of habitat for native plants and wildlife, and a vibrant rural/farm economy that embraces sustainable agricultural practices. *Note: this is not a land trust or conservation easement program: there are no obligations of membership.*
